FAQ Sheet BOSS Foundation

Q What is BOSS?

A BOSS is an official Department of the Army program managed by the Installation Management Command, Directorate of Family Morale, Welfare, and Recreation; executed at the Garrison level by Soldiers, for Soldiers.

Q What is the history of BOSS?

A BOSS was established in 1989 as a program for single Soldiers. It expanded in 1991 to include all areas of single Soldier's lives specifically Quality of Life. Then it evolved to also include Recreation and Leisure activities and Community Service.

Q Who is BOSS?

A Single Soldiers, unaccompanied Soldiers and single parents. Open to all ranks, both officer and enlisted. The program takes care of all single Service Members assigned to an Army installation.

Q Where are the references and regulations located for BOSS?

A BOSS operates under the guidance of AR 215-1, 8-11, DoDI 1015.10, AR 600-20, Army Community Recreation Reports Online (ACRRO), IMCOM BOSS SOP and Desk Reference and Fort Carson BOSS SOP.

Q What are the core components for BOSS?

A The foundation of BOSS is set upon 4 separate pillars; Quality of Life, Recreation and Leisure, Community Service and Life Skills.

Q What is Quality of Life?

A Includes issues that Soldiers can directly or indirectly influence to enhance their morale, living environment or personal growth and development. Issues are directed through the appropriate channels for resolution. Utilize DA 7380.

Q What is Recreation and Leisure?

A These events are geared towards the desires of the single Soldier. This is based on feedback from single Soldiers for ideas on activities. The activities should be diverse, covering many different areas of recreation. They are typically fee based.

Q What is Community Service?

A BOSS makes a difference by volunteering in community projects and events. This is done on the installation and in the local and surrounding communities. This is always voluntary in nature. Soldiers may receive awards for volunteer service.

Q What are Life Skills?

A Designed for single Soldiers, enabling them to gain lifelong knowledge or a particular skill and/or certification. In 2016, the Office of the Secretary of Defense included funding to support Life Skill events. Funding is determined by the size of the Garrison and single Soldier population.

Q What are the objectives for Life Skills?

A Life skills focus on a variety of areas including personal and character development, health and nutritional wellness, social interaction, leadership, physical strength, lifelong tangible learning and emotional stability.

Q What is the approval process for Life Skills?

A Life skill events require a checklist with 6 approval signatures, a CONOP detailing the synopsis, concept of operations, skills taught, registration, marketing, expenses and a specific timeline of events.

Army Education Funding

Tuition Assistance (TA)

- 16 SH per FY, up to \$250 per SH / \$4,000 per FY
- One degree at the Associate, Bachelor's, and Master's levels (no lower or lateral degrees)
- Up to 130 SH of undergraduate credit, up to 39 SH of graduate credit, up to 21 SH for an academic certificate (only 1 undergrad **or** grad cert per lifetime)
- TA funding available for Special Programs (AMEDD, Foreign language training, etc.)
- Provide an Evaluated Degree Plan prior to the completion of 6 SH
- Request TA in ArmyIgnitED up to 60 days prior and **no later** than 7 days prior to the **TERM** start date; Course must end 60 days prior to ETS date

CHECK YOUR BATTERY VOLTAGE


If there isn't a gauge on the instrument cluster, don't worry! Try simultaneously turning on your headlights, interior lights and radio. If it all seems to work normally, your battery should be in normal working order.

- Now try starting your car, if it starts, your battery is good!
- If the vehicle is running, your voltage should read about 14 volts. The starting and charging system is working as it should.

BATTERY VOLTAGE BEST PRACTICES

Engine off = 12–12.5 volts

Engine on = 13.5–14.7 volts



CHECK YOUR ENGINE OIL LEVEL

Check your engine oil weekly or every fuel fill-up. You can check the oil level whether your engine is cold or warm.

1. Remove the engine oil dipstick, wipe with a clean rag.
2. Reinstall oil dipstick.
3. Remove oil dipstick and read current oil level.



ALL ABOUT TIRES AND WINTER!!

Driving on Colorado roads during the winter requires specific tires to help ensure safe traveling. When it comes to snow or ice on the road, certain tires are safer because they provide better traction in winter conditions. Consider investing in safety by having a set of winter appropriate tires, that way you're prepared for any conditions that Colorado roads throw at you.



WINTER TIRES are safest for snowy and icy conditions, and they are recommended for driving in winter weather. The tread patterns in winter tires provide extra traction and stability, while the rubber compounds, helping the tire stay soft in cold temperatures for superior grip. All winter tires will have an icon looking like a mountain and snowflake.

MUD & SNOW (M+S) tires are all-season tires that provide better starting, stopping and driving performance in snowy conditions than non-M+S tires. The M+S tires are acceptable in light snow but are limited in comparison to winter tires.

ALL-WEATHER tires are considered safe in winter conditions, particularly conditions with heavy rain, slush or wet snow. The tread patterns in All-Weather tires provide extra traction and stability, while the rubber compound which allows the tire to stay flexible for various temperatures, grip on both wet and sandy roads, and dry asphalt. All-Weather tires are an efficient choice for year round use.



TRACTION AND CHAIN LAWS

All motorists are required to have at least one of the following:

- 4WD or AWD vehicles and 3/16" tread depth
- Tires with a mud and snow designation (M+S) icons and 3/16" tread depth
- Winter tires (Mountain-Snowflake icon) and 3/16" tread depth
- Tires with All-Weather rating by the manufacturer and 3/16" tread depth
- Chains or auto sock



FINES FOR NOT COMPLYING WITH STATE LAWS

- Requires all motorists to comply with traction law on I-70 between Dotsero and Morrison from September 1–May 31.
- Violators will be given a citation which comes with a \$100 fine (+\$32 surcharge). That jumps to a \$500 fine (+\$156 surcharge) if a violation results in the closure of one or more traffic lanes.
- The new law increases the minimum tread depth requirements for tires on all vehicles, including those with Four-Wheel (4WD) or All-Wheel Drive (AWD) vehicles from a 1/8" tread depth to 3/16" tread depth.

Fee assistance for full-time, in-home child care in eligible regions

Child Care in Your Home Fee Assistance Pilot Program

The Defense Department recognizes that quality, affordable child care is a critical support for military families. That's why the department created the Child Care in Your Home pilot program to help military families who have determined that full-time child care in their home best meets their needs.

The CCYH program provides fee assistance for 30 to 60 hours of child care weekly. To support military families with nontraditional work schedules, care is not limited to Monday through Friday or time of day.

A third party administrator, the Military Child Care Fee Assistance Management Team, oversees the program administration. Parents are the employer of their child care provider. They must find and employ their provider and are responsible for paying Social Security and other employer taxes, including Medicare. Reach out to Military OneSource tax consultants with questions about tax implications.

Service member eligibility and registration

To participate in the CCYH program, military families must reside in one of the approved program regions.

Eligible military families include active-duty single military, dual military, active-duty military with a full-time working spouse or a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis, and National Guard or reserve members on active duty with a full-time working spouse or a spouse enrolled in a postsecondary institution on a full-time basis who are seeking in-home child care and who live in the designated locations/regions that the program serves.

Create an account and request child care at MilitaryChildCare.com.

Child eligibility

Children ages 6 weeks to 5 years are eligible for the CCYH program; school-age children ages 6-12 years are eligible only when their younger siblings are offered care and enrolled in CCYH. Fee assistance will conclude at the end of the school year in which the child turns 13 years of age.



Child care provider eligibility

Providers must be eligible to work as a child care provider in the United States (e.g., be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident) and:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Hold a high school diploma or equivalent
- Read, speak and write English
- Comply with applicable employment laws, to include income tax regulations

CCYH providers may be lawful permanent residents and family members.

Sponsors may agree in writing to allow their CCYH provider to start caring for their child(ren) once the fingerprint-based FBI criminal history background check is completed and favorably adjudicated and initial training is completed.





School Support Services

A Driving Force for Student Success

Advance School Enrollment for an Inbound Active-Duty Military Member's Dependents

An active-duty military member who receives new orders, or a command letter issued in lieu of orders, for a permanent change of station to a Department of Defense Military installation within the state of Colorado can utilize the following legislation in order to enroll dependents in school.

(Please call the School Liaison Officer at 719-526-2463 for explanation of this law with regards to school registration in the state of Colorado)

Legislation Passed (Year): Yes (2021)

Specifies that electronic/remote enrollment must be allowed: Yes

Specifies that orders may be used to establish residency for enrollment: No

Specifies that families do not need to appear in person to enroll: Yes

Documentation Needed at Enrollment: Enrollment forms, *school liaison office address may be used for enrollment or to apply for open enrollment in a charter school*

Other Information Required and When Due: Proof of residency, disciplinary actions; within **10 days** of attendance in the school district

Enrollment Opportunities Specified: Specific schools, programs, courses, charter school enrollment/lottery/resident preference, open enrollment

Addresses that May Be Used to Establish Residency: Not specified, check with the school

Note: Legislation also provides for (1) guaranteed automatic matriculation while child remains in the school, district school or program, school district or charter school; (2) guaranteed automatic matriculation to the next grade; (3) priority preference for the younger sibling for subsequent school years.



What You Need for Your WIC Appointment

When you sign-up or renew your WIC enrollment, we will ask for proof of address and income for the family as well as proof of ID for each person applying for WIC benefits. Digital versions are accepted.

You must live in Colorado. You do not have to be a U.S. citizen to get benefits.

If you do not have any of the items listed or have questions, call the WIC clinic to find out what you should provide for your appointment.

Proof of Identification:

Provide any ONE item from the following list for EACH person who has an appointment, including babies and children. Documents must be original and not expired.

- Health First Colorado (Medicaid) card or screenshot of your active Medicaid status from your [Colorado PEAK account](#) or the [Health First mobile app](#).
- Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+) card.
- U.S. Driver's license. The Colorado Digital ID is accepted.
- Non-U.S. or International Driver's License or Photo ID Card - must include a picture. If ID is non-expiring, it must have been issued within 5 years of the issue date.
- Work/student/military ID.
- U.S. Government ID - must include a picture (includes I-94 noting SQ/SI parole).
- Passport from any country - must include a picture.
- U.S. Passport Card.
- The following documents are acceptable for infants when they include a hospital identifier, infant date of birth, and mother's name:
 - ✓ Infant wristband.
 - ✓ Hospital discharge papers.
 - ✓ Footprint card.
 - ✓ Application for birth certificate.
 - ✓ Documentation of birth from a Certified Nurse Midwife/ Registered Midwife.
- Alien Registration Receipt Card/Permanent Resident Card.
- Temporary Resident Card.
- Tribal Identification Card.
- U.S. Certificate of Naturalization.
- Certificate of U.S. Citizenship.
- Department of Corrections ID.
- Military Identification Card.
- Original or certified copy of birth certificate from any country, including temporary birth certificates.
- Green card.
- Matricula/Consular card.
- Original Social Security card.
- Foster Child Papers (issued by State or Local Human Services).
- U.S. Immunization Record (accepted for infant or child only).
- U.S. Hospital Documentation (accepted for infant only).
- Colorado eWIC card (for renewing participants only).

Proof of Address:

Provide any ONE item with your current address from the following list for your ENTIRE family. (Note: WIC can't accept P.O. boxes as proof of address.)

- Utility bill for electric, gas, phone, cable, or water.
- Written statement from landlord or person you live with - must include names of family members applying for WIC, address, landlord's or primary renter's name, signature, and date.
- Car Registration/Title/Insurance.
- Pay stub/W2 form.
- Matricula/Consular Card.
- Hospital/Medical documentation.

Proof of Income:

If participating in any of the following programs, provide proof of participation.

- Documentation of participation in Health First Colorado (Medicaid), SNAP (formerly known as 'food stamps'), Colorado Works (TANF), or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) can be used as proof of income.
 - Health First Colorado (Medicaid) card or screenshot of your active Medicaid status from your [Colorado PEAK account](#) or the [Health First mobile app](#); or
 - Award letter from SNAP (with beneficiary names), TANF, or FDPIR.

If your family is not participating in any of the programs listed above, you will need to provide proof of income for everyone in the household. If income is received from multiple sources, documentation must be provided from each source.

- Pay stubs.
- Disability Assistance (SSI) letter or check stubs.
- Military Leave and Earnings Statement (LES).
- Federal or State W-2 forms or income tax forms.
- Unemployment document.
- Written Statement from employer.
- Savings, checking, or CD account statements.

- Student Award Letter.
- Foster Placement/Award Letter.
- WIC's Verification of Certification (VOC)/Transfer paperwork - if currently enrolled in WIC in another state and recently moved to Colorado.

My Career Advancement Account Helping Spouses Reach Career Goals

Did you know?

Military spouses may use their My Career Advancement Account Scholarship at any approved institution to receive assistance with the costs of national tests for course credits required for a degree approved under the program (including the College Level Examination Program tests).

What is the My Career Advancement Account Scholarship?

The My Career Advancement Account Scholarship is a workforce development program that provides up to \$4,000 in financial assistance to eligible military spouses for the pursuit of a license, certification or associate degree or for continuing education courses to maintain a license or certification necessary for employment. The MyCAA Scholarship is part of the Defense Department Spouse Education and Career Opportunities program, which offers comprehensive coaching, information, tools and resources to support military spouses in meeting their career and education goals.

Who is eligible for MyCAA?

- ✓ Spouses of active-duty service members and spouses of National Guard and reserve service members on Title 10 orders in pay grades E-1 through E-9, W-1 through W-3 and O-1 through O-3.
- ✓ Spouses who have completed high school or obtained a GED.

You can continue your approved education and training plan if your sponsor is promoted.

Fast facts

- The My Career Advancement Account Scholarship provides a maximum tuition benefit of \$4,000 with an annual fiscal year cap of \$2,000 to assist eligible military spouses who need professional credentials to meet their career goals.
- The My Career Advancement Account Scholarship will pay for tuition and testing fees.
- You have a three-year time limit to use your My Career Advancement Account Scholarship funding, which begins on the start date of the first course taken.
- **NOTE:** Programs only leading to a certificate are not eligible for the My Career Advancement Account Scholarship. You must be in pursuit of a recognized postsecondary credential.

How to establish an account with the My Career Advancement Account Scholarship

Spouses can visit the My Career Advancement Account Scholarship website at <https://mycaa.militaryonesource.mil/mycaa> and provide the required **Spouse Profile** information. All scholarship participants are required to use DS Logon to access their accounts. Military spouses enrolled in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System are eligible for a DS Logon account. For information about creating a DS Logon premium account, click on the **Need Support?** button at the DS Logon page: <https://myaccess.dmdc.osd.mil/identitymanagement/app/login>.

1. PURPOSE. To inform all uniformed Armed Services personnel of areas and establishments that are declared Off-Limits in Colorado Springs and surrounding areas.
2. REFERENCE. AR 190-24, Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Boards and Off-Installations Liaison and Operations dated 27 July 2006.
3. APPLICABILITY. This memorandum applies to all uniformed Armed Forces personnel in the Fort Carson AOR regardless of assignment.
4. This list is current as of 12 June 2025 and supersedes the Off-Limits Areas and Establishments memorandum published on 20 March 2025.
5. OFF-LIMITS AREAS AND ESTABLISHMENTS. All uniformed Armed Forces personnel are prohibited from entering the following areas and establishments within Colorado Springs and surrounding areas.



Computer Tip



To ensure your document prints perfectly on standard **8.5 x 11** paper, the golden rule is to match your software settings to your physical paper before hitting 'print'.

Most "cut off" edges happen because the document is accidentally set to 'A4' (a common international size) or the margins are too wide for your printer to handle.

- Set the Size: In your program's **Page Setup** or **Layout** menu, verify the paper size is explicitly set to **Letter (8.5" x 11")**.
- Scale to Fit: In the final Print window, always check the box '**Fit to Page**' or '**Shrink to Fit**' to prevent text from leaking off the edges.
- Preview is Key: Always glance at the **Print Preview**; if it looks cut off on the screen, it will definitely be cut off on the paper.



Advance School Enrollment for Military Dependents

Inbound active-duty military members with orders to a Department of Defense installation in Colorado can utilize specific legislation to enroll their dependents in school remotely.

Key Highlights:

Remote Enrollment: Families can enroll electronically without appearing in person.

Residency Requirements: Orders cannot be used to establish residency, but enrollment may use the School Liaison Office address.

Required Documentation: Enrollment forms, proof of residency, and disciplinary records (due within 10 days of attendance).

Enrollment Opportunities: Access to specific schools, programs, courses, charter school enrollment, and open enrollment.

Additional Benefits: Guaranteed matriculation within the school or district.

Priority enrollment for younger siblings in future school years.



**STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE (SOP)
FOR
HOME BASED BUSINESS (HBB) APPLICATION
ON FORT CARSON, COLORADO**

1. Purpose: To provide information and explain procedural requirements for HBBs to operate on Fort Carson. These procedures apply to HBBs currently operating and those seeking authorization to operate on the installation.

2. References:

- a.** Army Regulation 210-22, Support for Non-Federal Entities Authorized to Operate on Department of The Army Installations, 12 May 2022.
- b.** IMCOM Policy Memorandum 215-1-14, IMCOM Garrison HBB Implementation Guidance, 8 January 2020.
- c.** Official Priority Information (OPI) 2023-07, IMCOM Home Based Business (HBB) Program, 12 June 2023.
- d.** Technical Bulletin (TB) MED 530, Tri-Service Food Code, 1 March 2019.

3. Scope: HBB Policy and Application guidance is intended to provide a standardized application and approval process across the installation, with one single designated Garrison staff point of contact (POC) as the entry point for processing applications.

4. Applicability:

- a.** Procedures are applicable to all requesting to operate as a HBB out of their residence on Fort Carson. Off-post residents are not considered as HBB and must follow applicable local, state, and federal guidance for establishing a business.
- b.** Procedures are not applicable to Child and Youth Services (CYS) Family Child Care (FCC) providers. Contact CYS for FCC services.
- c.** Permit is valid for one (1) year.
- d.** Examples of HBB include but are not limited to crafts, pet grooming, home décor, equipment rental, car repair services, cosmetology services, and cottage food sales.

e. Individuals who work remotely from their home such as consultants, freelance artist, telework, tax preparation, personal training (as long as the training is not conducted in the home), photography, and tutoring, do not require a permit.

5. Applicant must complete the application (Appendix A) and submit additional documentation (if applicable). The application is subject to change based on current requirements and governing regulation. Most recent version of the application can be obtained by:

a. Contacting the HBB Coordinator at Room 108, 1675 Ellis Street, Fort Carson, Colorado. Telephone (719) 362-7977.

b. Fort Carson MWR website (<https://carson.armymwr.com/HBB>)- submit information and HBB Coordinator will send application to provided email.

6. Procedures for HBB applications for businesses that do not involve food operations or cosmetology services.

a. Applicant will:

(1) Submit information (name, name of business, telephone number, address of proposed business, email address, if previously approved, and brief description of business) on Fort Carson MWR website (<https://carson.armymwr.com/HBB>)

(2) Print application once received from HBB Coordinator.

(3) Validate their understanding of the listed statements by checking each statement.

(4) Sign and Date

(5) Take the application to USAG Housing, Housing Community Manager (Balfour Beatty), and Installation Safety for initials and date.

(6) Applicants who are active duty may be required to submit a memorandum from their Company Commander stating that they are permitted to engage in business activities provided it does not affect their mission readiness.

(7) Turn the application into Room 108, 1675 Ellis Street, Fort Carson, Colorado

b. HBB Coordinator will:

(1) Send the completed application to the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) for legal review and recommendation.

(a) If the recommendation is to disapprove, SJA returns the application to the HBB Coordinator with a memorandum explaining the reason for disapproval.

(b) If the recommendation is to approve, the HBB Coordinator submits the application, legal review, and additional documents to the Approving Authority for final approval. The Approving Authority will sign the HBB Certificate (APPENDIX B). Senior Commander has the authority to delegate approval of Non-Federal Entities to the Garrison Commander, who will delegate HBB approval authority to the Marketing Director, DFMWR.

(2) Notify the applicant of approval and issue an Official HBB Certificate (APPENDIX B). The Marketing Director signs the permit.

(3) Maintain the application packet and legal review on file at Marketing (MKT) office.

7. Procedures for HBB applications for businesses that involve cottage food operations:

a. Only cottage foods as outlined in TB MED 530 are permitted on Fort Carson.

b. In addition to the requirements established in paragraph 6-a-(1) through 6-a-(7), HBB handling food must also satisfy and maintain the following to operate on Fort Carson:

(1) Training and certification as a ServSafe Manager.

(2) Approved home inspection conducted by Environmental Health and compliance to applicable food safety and sanitation conditions. The report of the inspection must be included in the packet.

(3) Liability Insurance for food operations.

c. Applicants can contact Environmental Health by phone at 719-586-3231 for additional information on satisfying requirements. Fees may apply.

8. Procedures for HBB Applications for businesses that involve cosmetology operations:

a. Cosmetology operations include but are not limited to hair styling, hair cutting, barber services, eyebrow styling, eyelash extensions, massage services, and nail salon services.

b. In addition to the requirements established in paragraph 6-a-(1) through 6-a-(7), HBB providing cosmetology services must also satisfy and maintain the following to operate on Fort Carson:

(1) Training and licensing as a cosmetology technician/specialist. The license must be valid in the state of Colorado. Requirements are set forth by the Colorado Board of Cosmetology.

(2) Approved home inspection conducted by Environmental Health and compliance to applicable cosmetology safety and sanitation conditions. The report of the inspection must be included in the packet.

c. Body art operations are strictly prohibited to operate on the installation and will not be approved. Body art operations are defined as businesses involving tattooing, application of permanent makeup, body piercing (except for ear piercing), Henna, and other invasive treatments.

9. Reporting requirements: The HBB Coordinator will report the status of HBBs on the installation as required by IMCOM G9 or its regional Directorate via required channel. The HBB Coordinator will ensure all Data Calls and taskers are completed in the required time.

10. Adverse Actions for HBBs:

a. HBB Coordinator will review any reports of HBB practices received.

b. If the HBB is approved to operate and the report is considered unfounded, no action will be taken against the HBB. The party reporting will be notified of the approved status of the HBB.

c. If the HBB is not approved to operate, the HBB Coordinator will obtain necessary information (name, address) through partner organizations and send a Letter of Warning (Appendix C) to the occupants of the housing unit. The Letter of Warning will be tailored to the specifics of the business and sent by official mail to the occupants of the housing unit. USAG Housing and Balfour Beatty will be notified of all Letters of Warning sent.

c. Regardless of the status of the HBB, if the report alleges negligent, unlawful, dangerous, or criminal activities, appropriate partner organizations and/or agencies will be notified to inspect and/or investigate. HBB Coordinator will not perform such inspections or investigations.

d. The HBB Coordinator is not responsible for monitoring the community for compliance or enforcing the regulations, requirements, or law regarding any aspect of HBB operations.

11. The Senior Commander or their delegated authority can revoke the status of a HBB at any time.

- Conduct classroom observations

- Bullying
- Self-esteem
- Separation from parents
- Problem solving




