Students may sign up for credit recovery during one session or both sessions of Language Arts, Science, and/or Social Studies. These courses will be offered through APEX but will also require additional assignments. All math classes will be two and a hait weeks. STEM Science classes will be for extension only and will be for five weeks, students will be required to attend both sessions. Classes for high school credit will be held Monday through Friday. <u>There will be no</u> classes on Thursday, July 4, 2019.

COST

Each two and a half-week APEX session is: \$40 for students receiving free lunch; \$70 for students receiving a reduced lunch rate; and \$120 for students paying a full lunch rate. Students signing up for math will pay: \$40 for students receiving a reduced lunch rate; and \$120 for students receiving a reduced lunch rate; and \$120 for students paying a full lunch rate; for the full five week session. Credits for all classes will be applied to a student's transcripts after the course is complete. A 25% deposit is required at the time of

registration. The remaining balance is due in full by Friday, June 14, 2019. Students not enrolled in Fountain-Fort Carson School District 8 will pay \$240 for each four-hour class.
