

Free School Meals

Fountain-Fort Carson School District Eight offers free meals Mondays-Wednesdays during the winter break. Meal pickup is 9-10 a.m. on Dec. 21-23, Dec. 28-30 and Jan. 4-6 at any of the five schools on post or off post at Aragon, Eagleside or Mesa elementary schools or Fountain-Fort Carson High School. Bags on Mondays and Tuesdays will have two breakfasts and lunches; bags on Wednesdays will have three breakfasts and lunches. Children do not need to be present for meal pickup. Any students under the age of 18 are eligible for the free meals, regardless of which school they attend.

Extended Downrange Passes

Fort Carson Range Operations will have new passes for calendar year 2021. Any individual who may be in possession of a current extended pass, is hereby notified that those passes issued in 2020 or prior will no longer be valid. If you have an extended pass, bring your current pass to the Range Operations Safety Office to have the pass exchanged for a new one. Individuals who display the old pass after Jan. 1 will have the pass confiscated and must report to the Range Safety Office to get a new one. ARE YOU ABOUT TO PCS?

AER can help Active Duty Soldiers, Active Guard and Reserve Soldiers*, and their Families, with zero-interest loans, grants, or a combination of both.

Title 10 orders for at least 31 consecutive days. Exceptions may apply. Talk to your nearest Military Aid Office.

AER CAN HELP

AER can help with expenses before, during, and after a PCS, such as auto repair, rent deposit, temporary lodging, appliance repair, child care assistance, spouse relicensing, and more.



Assistance for pet-boarding may be offered as an exception.

Talk to your nearest AER officer to learn more.



HOW TO APPLY

3 ways to receive assistance from AER:

- 1. Talk to your Chain of Command
- 2. Visit your nearest AER office at armyemergencyrelief.org/offices
- 3. Call the American Red Cross at 1-877-272-7337

DETAILS ABOUT PET BOARDING

- AER may provide assistance for pet boarding fees, as an exception, for Soldiers affected by the COVID-19 pre & post PCS 14-day guarantine (Restriction of Movement)
- Pet boarding assistance may be provided for up to 15 days pre and post PCS (30 days total)
- Requests for more than 30 days of pet boarding will be forwarded to HQ AER for
- Soldiers must provide an estimate of the pet boarding costs
- Assistance may be provided as a zero-interest loan, grant, or combination of both

You see your PCM for all routine, non-emergency, and urgent health care. If your PCM can't provide your care, you'll get a referral to see a specialist.



You can change your PCM at any time.

YOUR REQUEST:

- Must comply with guidelines at the local military hospital or clinic.
 - . May take up to 6 days to confirm.
- If you're an active duty service member, your PCM will be assigned.
