SINGLE SOLDIERS IN BARRACKS & MAIL

Description

Soldiers on Fort Carson receive their mail, by mail delivery to their unit's mailroom or by picking it up at the Fort Carson Post Office, which is part of the U.S. Postal Service network. Mail is addressed to the soldier's name and unit, sorted within the military postal system, and delivered to the base for distribution to individual soldiers by unit mail clerks.

How Mail is Delivered:

- 1. Address Your Mail Correctly: To send mail to a soldier on Fort Carson, use their specific unit address, including their name.
- 2. Mail Enters the Postal System: The mail is processed like any other domestic mail by the U.S. Postal Service.
- 3. Military Postal Service Takes Over: The USPS turns the mail over to the military mail system for delivery on the installation.
- 4. Delivery to Fort Carson: Mail is delivered to the Army Post Office (APO) on Fort Carson.
- 5. Unit Distribution: Unit mail clerks receive the mail for their specific company, battery, or troop.
- 6. Personal Delivery: The unit mail clerk distributes the mail to individual soldiers within that unit.
