

Things to Remember

Mesa SAC Summer Break Hours of Operation: Monday-Friday 5:45am-6:00pm

A signed permission slip is needed for all fieldtrips as well as for some specialty activities as well. Parents will receive permission slips in advance prior to any activity requiring them.

Along with smiles, children should wear appropriate clothing and shoes, especially to participate in fieldtrips. Sneakers are encouraged at all times for participation in daily activities at CYS programs. Please do not allow your child to wear open-toed shoes, like flip-flops. Shoes such as sandals and slippers should be closed-toe and have a backstrap.

A current physical (less than one year old) dated, stamped and signed by a physician is needed to attend any CYS program. If your child is in need of a current physical, speak to the facility clerks or the staff at Parent Central Services and they can set you on the right path.

All camps, activities, fieldtrips are subject to change due to weather, availability, and program needs.

Campers will not be able to switch camps without parent and Director's permission.

If a camp has less than 10 children enrolled, it may be canceled or swapped for another camp.

Unfortunately, outside food and drinks are not allowed in any CYS Program. If your child has special dietary requirements just mention it to the facility management or the staff at Parent Central Services staff and they can assist you with accommodations.

Personal Property: CYS is not responsible for any lost or stolen items and strongly discourages children bringing in valuable items such as handheld gaming devices, cell phones, iPods, action figures/dolls, etc.

Special Needs: If your child has any special needs such as asthma, allergies, diabetes, seizures, or any other type of special need, additional paperwork is needed as well as a Special Needs Accommodation Process (SNAP) team meeting prior to starting any Program. SNAP paperwork and meetings are for the safety wellbeing for those who may have any special needs. For more information about Special Needs, just as a facility clerk or the staff at Parent Central Services.
