Eligibility Our veterans courses are open to active duty military and veterans. All applicants to our veterans courses will be asked to verify their service.

We welcome veterans back to take a second course after your first course has been completed, but ask that alumni not enroll on two courses in the same year. Veteran courses allow for an applicant to complete two courses total. Given the limited space available on our courses priority will always be given to those who have not attended a course with us previously. However, if you have been deployed since your last veterans' course, you are welcome to apply again and we will reserve a spot on course for you right away. To reduce an extremely high cancel rate for these fully funded courses, we now require applicants to submit a \$50 non-refundable Commitment Fee at time of enrollment. If this fee is a financial barrier, please call our National Admissions Office at <u>866-467-7651</u> to request a Commitment Fee Waiver. The waiver process includes submitting a Statement of Commitment confirming your intent to follow through with this program.Reducing revolving enrollments helps us keep our course inventory more accessible. Thank you for your cooperation.

Who Is Eligible for a Military Annual Pass

Current members of the US Armed Forces and their dependents are eligible for a Military Annual Pass.

How to Get a Military Annual Pass In Person

You can pick up a Military Annual Pass for free at many national parks and federal recreation sites. You'll need to bring one of three valid forms of identification:

- Unexpired Common Access Card (CAC)
- Unexpired DD Form 1173

Unexpired Next Generation Dependent ID (Replacement of DD Form 1173)

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From national parks to world-class museums, Colorado offers complimentary admission on regular dates throughout the season, every year. Get free entry on a select day(s) at the Denver Zoo, Botanic Gardens, Art Museum, Museum of Nature & Science, State Parks, and Colorado's four National Parks.



2025 Free Admission at Colorado National Parks:

These are good for <u>all National Park</u> <u>Service entrance fees</u>, including national monuments, forest day-use areas, and the major four parks: Black Canyon of the Gunnison, Great Sand Dunes, Mesa Verde, and Rocky Mountain National. Learn more about <u>Colorado's federal lands</u>. It's the same across the country, in case you've been looking to check our Yellowstone or Glacier.
