





Charter Oak Ranch Road construction near Gate 19

Beginning January 3rd, the Colorado Department of Transportation will begin work on Charter Oak Ranch Road between Santa Fe Avenue and Fort Carson Gate 19. Motorists should expect to see intermittent single lane closures Monday-Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Flaggers will be available to assist motorists as needed. These lane closures will continue intermittently through spring.

IMPROVEMENTS

- · Roadway Improvements: The road will be rebuilt and widened in the westbound direction from the intersection with Santa Fe Avenue to Gate 19. A roundabout will replace the four-way stop sign intersection with Santa Fe Avenue. Curb and gutter, and a sidewalk will also be added along with improving an inadequate curve radius for this stretch. Turn lanes would be added for enhancing access to businesses and Fort Carson.
- · Drainage Improvements: This will entail the replacement of existing features with new pipes, inlets and water quality/detention features along various locations of the Charter Oak Ranch Road segment where roadway improvements are planned.
- · Structural Improvements: To accommodate the realignment and widening, retaining walls will be constructed to retain the associated embankments that will be constructed.
- · Safety Benefits: Improve infrastructure and enhance connectivity and efficiency for Charter Oak Ranch Road, the entry point to Fort Carson's Gate 19 from the I-25 corridor.







The Fort Carson Employee Assistance Program is a free service available to Department of Army Civilian Employees, active duty-spouse and family members, and retired military and eligible family members. The program offers short-term screening, intervention and referral services, crisis intervention, worksite intervention, consultation services, a wide variety of trainings, and reintegration assistance.

Professional Services

- The EAP is a professional service that provides assistance with adult living problems, counseling, resource identification, referral, and follow-up services.
- The EAP assists employees, supervisors, and managers with issues related to productivity, morale, motivation, communication, conflict, and mediation.
- The EAP provides consultation services, prevention education and training, worksite interventions and assists with such issues as grief and loss, the drugfree workplace, workplace violence, and suicide.
- The EAP is the point-of-contact for Hospital's Impaired Health-Care Personnel Program and assists with screening, referral to treatment, and return to duty. The EAP provides continuing education and training to health care providers. The program offers CME, CNE, for continuing education.
